COMPLYING WITH THE CLEAN WATER ACT:

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA?

How is Western Pennsylvania Tackling the Challenges of its Water and Sewer Systems?

- 213 watersheds exist in Allegheny County.
- There are 11 counties with 595 municipalities, including 492 water and sewer entities.
- A mapping project has been developed, with 85,000 manholes mapped to this point at an estimated cost of \$2 million.
- A flow monitoring plan, implemented by ALCOSAN, is being developed. The data from the flow monitoring will help to develop a long range control plan.
- Senate Bill 176 is proposed. This would allow public funding to be used for private lateral repairs.

Alternatives to How We Are Currently Handling the Challenges

- Watershed and regional based solutions
- Regional financing
- Consolidating the sewer collection systems
- Addressing stormwater with low impact development (lot level development) and improved operations and maintenance practices.
- Adaptive Governance: Flexible government that is able to adjust to change

DID YOU KNOW THESE FACTS ABOUT WATER AND WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA?

75% of the earth's surface is water.

60% of the human body is water.

The population has increased in the United States, but the water demand has remained the same due to increased conservation efforts.

90% of Allegheny County's population gets their drinking water from streams and rivers that contain direct sewage discharges.

½ of the 138 day recreation season has advisories. An advisory is a daily river water quality report indicating an overflow has occurred in a combined sewer system, where the excess flow pollutes rivers and streams.
